## Registering to vote – further information

You can only vote in elections if your name is on the register of electors.

When you send us your form, we will add you to our list of new applications. Any elector can then object to your name being added to the register. If this happens, we will write to you. If your application is not objected to, we will change your details as per the following timetable. We will write to tell you when your application is allowed.

We will also tell the Electoral Registration Officer for your old address that you have moved, so that your name can be removed from that register. People who live at two homes (including students) are allowed to register at both.

### The two versions of the register

The electoral registration officer makes and keeps two versions of the electoral register – the full register and the edited register.

**The full register** lists everyone who is entitled to vote. You can check this at the council offices. The Representation of the People (England and Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002 says who can have a copy of the full register and what they can use it for. This includes electoral purposes, the prevention and detection of crime and checking your identity when you have applied for credit. It is a criminal offence to pass it on to anyone else or to use it for any other purpose.

**The edited register** is available for sale to anyone and can be used for any purpose. You can choose not to appear in the edited version of the register by ticking the box overleaf. If you tick the box your name and address will not appear in the register available for general sale.
