Declaration Of Local Connection (Homeless)

You can vote in elections only if your name is included in the Register of Electors. You can register as soon as you move to a new address. If you are not registered you will lose your right to vote in local council, national and European parliamentary elections, and may also find it difficult to obtain credit or other benefits.

To be included in the Register you need to be a British citizen, including any Commonwealth or Dependant territories citizen, or a citizen of the Irish Republic or another member state of the European Union (these are Austria, Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Greece, Italy, Luxemburg, the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain and Sweden). You must be living in the Borough of Islington, or able to give a Declaration of Local Connection and be 18 to vote, although you can register at 16 or 17.

If you are homeless, or do not have a permanent home, you can still register to using this Declaration of Local Connection. Give details of the location where you spend a substantial part of the day or night. This need not be a traditional bricks & mortar address but could be a hostel, shop doorway or railway arch. Say how long you been have using this location.

You should also give an address for correspondence to let the Registration Officer contact you. This could be a friend or relative's address. Please also give your old address to allow the Registration Officer to let the ERO for your old address know that you have moved so that he/she can delete your name from their Register.

TWO REGISTERS: The Registration of Electors is published in two versions. The "FULL" register lists everyone who can vote. Only certain people and organisations can have copies and can use it only for specified purposes. These include political parties for electoral purposes, the Police for crime prevention and Credit Agencies for checking identity in credit applications. For a full list please see the Representation of the People (England & Wales) (Amendment) Regulations 2002. These Regulations make it a criminal offence to pass on the information to others, or to use it for any other purpose than it was issued. The "EDITED" Register leaves out the names of those electors who have asked for their details to be excluded from that version. If you do not want your details to be passed on in this way you should "opt-out" of the Edited Register by ticking the box over the page.

If you have a postal or proxy vote already and would like this to continue, please let the Registration Officer (and the proxy if appropriate) know. If you don't already have a postal or proxy vote but would find it more convenient to vote that way, please get in touch with the Registration Officer. He/she will advise you which would be the best for your circumstances.

If your application is approved after the closing date for Nominations at an election you will not be able to vote in that election. If submitted during September, October or November the application will be approved and included in a Revised Register published on 1st December each year. At other times the application should be submitted about 3 weeks before the end of the month to be included from the 1st of the following month.

The list of applications is available for inspection and other electors are allowed to make objections. If an objection is received a hearing will be held where both parties will be asked to justify the application and objection.

The Registration Officer will write to you between three and two months before your application is due for renewal.
