Islington Secondary School Co-ordinated Admissions Scheme 2010/11

Applications

Islington Local Authority will advise home local authorities during the summer term of year 5 of their resident pupils on the roll of Islington's maintained primary schools and whose parents are eligible to make application in the forthcoming application year.

Applications from residents of Islington Local Authority will be made on Islington's School Admissions Application Form (SAAF). Applications may also be made on-line at www.islingtonschools.net/admissions.

Islington Local Authority will take all reasonable steps to ensure that every parent who has a child in their last year of primary education within a maintained school, either in Islington or elsewhere, and who is resident in Islington:

- Receives a copy of the Islington schools brochure and
- School Admissions Application Form
- Will receive information about how to make an online application.

The brochure will also be available to parents who are non-residents, and will include information on how they can access their home local authority's equivalent School Admissions Application Form. The brochure will also be available online.

The admission authorities within Islington will not use supplementary forms except where the information available through the School Admissions Application Form is insufficient for consideration of the application against their published oversubscription criteria. Where the admissions authorities within Islington use supplementary forms, we will seek to ensure that they only collect information that is required by the published oversubscription criteria.

Where supplementary forms are used, they will be made available within Islington's booklet *Moving On— A Guide for Parents and Carers on Transferring to Secondary School*. However, parents who live outside Islington may request supplementary forms from the schools concerned. Any supplementary forms must advise parents that they must also complete their home local authority's School Admissions Application Form. The Islington schools' booklet will indicate which Islington schools require supplementary information forms to be completed.

Where a school receives a supplementary information form it will not be regarded as a valid application unless the parent has also completed either the Islington School Admissions Application Form or, if resident in another local authority, the

School Admissions Application Form from their home local authority and the school is named as a preference on it.

Islington Local Authority will share the details of each application for an Islington voluntary-aided school with that school. Schools that require a supplementary information form will check that each parent has completed one. If one has not been received the school will make contact with the parent and ask them to complete one. The school will also check that each parent that has completed a supplementary form has completed a School Admissions Application Form. If any parent has not completed a School Admissions Application Form, the school will share that information with Islington Local Authority who will then contact the parent and ask them to complete one. Under the requirements of the scheme, parents will not have to complete an individual school's supplementary information form where this is not strictly required for the governing body to apply their admissions criteria. In cases where only a supplementary form is completed even after contact with the parents, the application is not valid and may not be considered. It is however, a valid application in cases where only the School Admissions Application Form is received and schools MUST rank the application according to the information available to them.

Applicants will be able to express a preference for up to six maintained secondary schools within and/or outside Islington Local Authority (including Academies and any City Technology College that has agreed to participate in their local authority's Qualifying Scheme).

Applicants will be advised that they will receive no more than one offer of a school place, unless they have also applied for a school in a local authority which is not participating in the Pan-London scheme, and that a place will be offered at the highest ranking nominated school for which they are eligible for a place.

The order of preference given on the School Admissions Application Form will not be revealed. However, where a parent resident in Islington expresses a preference for schools in the area of another local authority, the order of preference for that local authority's schools will be revealed to that local authority in order that it can determine the highest ranked preference in cases where a child is eligible for a place at more than one school in that local authority's area.

Processing

Applicants resident within Islington must complete and return the School Admissions Application Form, to this local authority by 23 October 2009. Those applying on-line must submit their application by mid-night on 23 October 2009.

Supplementary information forms, where they apply, must be returned directly to the relevant schools by the date specified by the school.

Any changes to preferences or the order of preference on a School Admissions Application Form after 23 October 2009 will mean that the application will be treated as late.

Any school that operates a banding system that requires testing to take place must ensure that their timetable coincides with the scheme timetable set out in Appendix A.

Application data relating to applications to schools in other participating local authorities will be up-loaded to the Pan London Register (PLR) on 16 November 2009. Supplementary information provided with the School Admissions Application Form will be sent to Islington voluntary-aided schools/maintaining local authorities by the same date.

Application data relating to Islington schools from out-of-borough pupils will be received from the Pan London Register on 18 November 2009.

Between 18 November 2009 and 25 November 2009, Islington Local Authority will check the application data received from out-of-borough pupils.

Islington Local Authority will notify each school within Islington that is its own admissions authority of every preference that has been made for the school, forwarding them all relevant details from the School Admissions Application Form by 2 November 2009 for Islington residents and, for non-Islington residents, by 26 November 2009.

Between 26 November 2009 and 20 January 2010, voluntary-aided/foundation schools and Academies will assess their applications according to their admissions criteria.

All preferences for schools within Islington will be considered without reference to rank order. When the admission authorities within Islington have provided a list of applicants in criteria order, Islington Local Authority shall, for each applicant to its schools for whom more than one potential offer is available, use the highest ranked potential offer to decide which single offer to make.

Schools which are their own admissions authority must provide the Local Authority with an electronic list of their applicants in rank order by 20 January 2010.

Islington Local Authority will send the first ALT file to the Pan-London Register (PLR) giving offer details for their school on 3 February 2010 and then exchange two files a day for the two week period up to the last file on 16 February 2010.

Between 16 February 2010 and 24 February 2010 Islington Local Authority will participate in the offer data checking exercise scheduled in the Pan-London timetable.

Islington Local Authority will send a file to the E-Admissions portal with outcomes for all residents who have applied online no later than 24 February 2010.

Offers

Islington Local Authority will upload the highest potential offer available to an applicant for a maintained school in Islington to the Pan-London Register (PLR) on

3 February 2010. The PLR will transmit the highest potential offer made by the maintaining local authority to the home local authority.

Islington's local admissions system will eliminate, as a home local authority, all but the highest ranked offer where an applicant has more than one potential offer across maintaining local authorities, submitting information within deadline to the PLR. This will involve exchanges of information between the local system and the PLR (in accordance with a specified iterative timetable) that will continue until a steady state is achieved (which the PLR will indicate) or until 16 February 2010 if this is sooner.

Islington has agreed, for the purposes of Paragraphs 2(e), 4(d) and 4(e) of the Schedule to the Regulations, that the home local authorities shall inform all applicants within their areas of their highest offer of a school place and, where relevant, the reasons why higher preferences were not offered, whether they were for schools in the home local authority or in other participating local authorities.

Islington will use the 'Notification Letters' set out in Schedules 1 & 2.

Notification of the outcome will be sent by first class post to parents on 1 March 2010.

Details of the pupils to be offered will be made available to each Islington primary school by 3 March 2010.

Parents who are not successful in their application for a school will be offered a right of appeal.

Late Applications

Islington will accept late applications as on time in the following circumstances:

- A proven administrative error has occurred on behalf of either the school (primary) or the School Admissions Team;
- The pupil has just moved into the area from outside the Pan-London scheme area.

Where such applications contain preferences for schools in other local authorities, this local authority will forward the details to maintaining local authorities via the Pan-London Register as they are received. This local authority will accept late applications that are considered to be on time within the terms of the home local authority's scheme.

The latest date for the upload of late applications which are considered to be on time, within the terms of the home local authority's scheme, to the Pan-London Register is 11 December 2009.

Applications which are late for reasons other than those considered above (31) and those that are received after 11 December 2009 but before 1 March 2010, will not be considered in the initial allocation round but will be allocated after all other applications have been processed. If the application is from an Islington resident, and they cannot be offered a place at one of their preferences, they will be considered for a place at Islington maintained schools with vacancies, according to the published admission criteria. If the application is from a resident of another local authority, their application will only be considered for the school to which they have applied.

After 'Offer Day', Islington will accept applications from Islington residents (including additional preferences) between 1 March 2010 and 31 August 2010. New applicants will be expected to complete a School Admissions Application Form. Islington will also accept applications from out-of-borough residents for Islington schools on other local authority's School Admissions Application Forms.

Where such applications include a preference for an out-of-borough school, Islington local authority will pass the late preferences to the maintaining local authorities without delay.

Post-offer

Parents must accept or decline the offer of a place by 15 March 2010. If they do not respond by this date the local authority or the school, where it is its own admission authority, will make every reasonable effort to contact the parent to find out whether or not they wish to accept the place. Only where the parent fails to respond and this local authority or school, where it is its own admission authority, can demonstrate that every reasonable effort has been made to contact the parent, will the offer of a place be withdrawn. (The School Admissions Code states that an admission authority may only lawfully withdraw an offer in very limited circumstances. This may include where a parent has not responded to the offer within a reasonable time).

Where a parent accepts or declines a place by 15 March 2010, this information will be passed on to the appropriate school within Islington, or for out-of-borough schools, to the maintaining local authority, by 22 March 2010. Subsequent information will be transferred as and when it is received.

Acceptances or declines from out-of-borough residents will be passed on to the appropriate school once received from the home local authority.

In the period 1 March to 31 August 2010 Islington Local Authority will seek to ensure that a place is not offered at a school in its area which is ranked on the School Admissions Application Form as a lower preference than any school already offered to a parent.

In the period 1 March to 31 August 2010, Islington Local Authority will inform the home local authority of any change to an applicant's offer status as soon as it occurs.

This local authority will share the destination school of each Islington child with their primary school, by the beginning of May 2010.

Waiting Lists

Where a child does not receive an offer of their first preference, his/her name will automatically be placed on the waiting list for each Islington school for which he/she is eligible, that is a higher preference school to the one that has been offered. Parents will be advised that if they want to go on the waiting list for an out-of-borough school they should contact that school's maintaining local authority.

Parents who are unsuccessful in receiving an offer will be given the opportunity to make applications to Islington schools that they did not originally apply to.

Waiting lists will be kept by all maintained admission authorities in Islington and coordinated centrally by this local authority as part of the coordination of all in year admissions and Fair Access Protocol for secondary schools. Academies, voluntary-aided and foundation schools will apply their own admission arrangements and inform Islington local authority before offering places. Waiting lists for community schools will be administered centrally by the local authority.

Waiting lists for entry to Year 7 in September 2010 will be compiled on 23 March 2010 (after the deadline for acceptance of places) and will be kept in strict criteria order with no differentiation between on-time or late applications.

In all statutory school year groups, when a place is allocated from the waiting list, schools which are their own admission authorities, will notify Islington local authority before an offer is made. Islington local authority will check for alternative offers and, if the child has a multiple offer, will contact the parent to establish which offer they wish to accept. The outcome will be shared with each school or maintaining local authority (if one of the schools is out-of-borough), or home local authority (if pupil is out-of-borough).

Waiting lists will be maintained and places allocated, as they become available, in accordance with each admission authority's published admission and oversubscription criteria.

Data checking

Between 18 November 2009 and 25 November 2009, Islington Local Authority will participate in a Pan-London data checking exercise of pupil application data shared through the Pan-London Register.

Between 15 February 2010 and 24 February 2010, Islington Local Authority will participate in a Pan-London data checking exercise of pupil offer and decline data shared through the Pan-London Register.

Islington Community Secondary School Admissions Policy and Oversubscription Criteria 2010/11

Children should be admitted to a community secondary school of their parents' preference where there is a place available.

Applicants with a Statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN) will be placed via the SEN process as outlined in Section 324 of the Education Act 1996 at the school named in the Statement.

In the event of over-subscription to a community secondary school, the following criteria will apply in the following order:

1) Looked after children

2) Siblings: A sibling is defined as a brother or sister, half brother or sister, step brother or sister or adopted brother or sister whose main residence is at the same address. Applicants who have a sibling living at the same address on the roll of the school *in Years 7 to 11 at the time of admission in the new academic year.*

3) Social/Medical: The Director of Education Services, on an individual basis, may give priority to applicants who can demonstrate that admission to a particular school is necessary on the grounds of professionally supported **medical, social or special educational needs**. Parents must supply details of any such special factors at the time of the original application (together with recent supporting documentation), to enable these factors to be considered by Cambridge Education @ Islington, acting on behalf of Islington Council.

4) Distance: applicants who live nearest to the preferred school. Nearness to schools is measured on a computerised mapping system of the area, measurement being over the shortest safest walking route based on Ordnance Survey route network data from the property address to the main school gate. Accessibility by private car or public transport is not taken into account.

Distance will be used as a tiebreaker for each over-subscription criterion.

Multiple births

If only one place is available at the school and the next child who qualifies for a place is one of multiple birth siblings we will ask community schools to go over their published admission number to support the family.

- 1) Applications for Islington primary school will be made on this authority's primary School Admissions Application Form (SAAF).
- 2) Parents wishing to make a preference for a voluntary-aided school may also need to complete a supplementary information form, which they can obtain from the relevant school (Church of England Deanery Supplementary Information Form, Diocese of Westminster Catholic Supplementary Information Form which are also available the primary schools booklet). The supplementary information form will be solely for the purpose of demonstrating that the applicant meets the specific criteria of the school applied for.
- 3) Applicants will be able to express a preference for up to three maintained primary schools within Islington. Applications to schools outside Islington should be made directly to the maintaining local authority using that local authority's School Admissions Application Form (which can be obtained from the maintaining local authority)
- 4) The order of preference given on the School Admissions Application Form (SAAF) will not be revealed.
- 5) Schools who receive direct application forms (whether or not the parent lives in Islington) must send these to the maintaining local authority for action.
- 6) Timetable for processing of application data and application of admissions criteria.

- 7) Governing bodies who are the admissions authority for their school must relay information lists, showing the order in which they rank applications for places, to their maintaining local authority by the date specified in the scheme.
- 8) All preferences will be considered by the relevant admission authorities without reference to rank order. When the admission authorities within Islington have provided a list of applicants in criteria order to the local authority, the local authority shall, for each applicant to its schools for whom more than one potential offer is available, use the highest ranked preference to decide which single potential offer to make. (This is the 'Equal Preference' System).
- 9) Islington Local Authority uses the 'Equal Preference' model whereby:

- All preference listed on the SAAF are considered under oversubscription criteria for each school without reference to parental rankings;
 - Where a pupil is offered a place at more than one school within a local authority, the rankings are used to determine the single offer by selecting the one ranked highest of the places offered.
- 10) Islington Local Authority will notify the admission authority or the child's home local authority of the single offer.
- 11) All offers of a school place in Islington will be transmitted by the local authority
- 12) All offers of primary places for September and January admission will be made on the date specified within the scheme. There may be more than a single offer per child if schools in more than one local authority are able to make an offer.
- 13) Islington will accept late applications only in the following circumstances:
- Where a child has moved in from outside Islington;
 - Where there has been a proven administrative error in the processing of the application.

All other late applications will be processed once parents who applied within the normal round of applications have confirmed their acceptance of places offered.

- 14) Children without a school place, who have been refused admission to every suitable school within a reasonable distance of their home because of over-subscription, would normally be prioritised within our published criteria on the grounds of social priority. Where a child already has a school place, no other circumstances have changed and their preferred school is fully subscribed, waiting list arrangements will apply.
- 15) Waiting lists will be created on **2 June 2010** (after the deadline for acceptance of places). If a child does not get a place at their preferred school they will automatically be placed on the waiting list. The waiting list will include the names of all children who would like a place at the school and have not been offered a higher preference, but for whom a place is currently not available. If a child already at the school leaves, this vacant place will then be offered to the child whose name appears at the top of the waiting list.
- 16) The order of the waiting list will be determined using the published admissions criteria and there will be no differentiation between on-time and late applications.
- 17) A child's position on a waiting list can go down as well as up, for example if a child on the waiting list moves nearer to the school. The offer of a school place will not depend on the length of a time a child's name has been on the list.

Applicants with a Statement of Special Educational Needs (SEN) which names the school will be placed via the SEN process as outlined in Section 324 of the Education Act 1996 at the school named in the Statement.

In the event of over-subscription to a community primary school, the following criteria will apply in the following order:

1) Looked after children:

- 2) **Siblings:** A sibling is defined as a brother or sister, half brother or sister, step brother or sister or adopted brother or sister whose main residence is at the same address. Applicants who have a sibling living at the same address on the roll of the school *in Reception to Year 6 at the time of admission* in the new academic year.
- 3) The Director of Education Services, on an individual basis, may give priority to applicants who can demonstrate that admission to a particular school is necessary on the grounds of professionally supported **medical, social or special educational needs**. Parents must supply details of any such special factors at the time of the original application (together with recent supporting documentation), to enable these factors to be considered by Cambridge Education @ Islington, acting on behalf of Islington Council.
- 4) **Distance:** applicants who live nearest to the preferred school. Nearness to schools is measured on a computerised mapping system of the area, measurement being over the shortest safest walking route based on Ordnance Survey route network data from the property address to the main school gate. Accessibility by private car or public transport is not taken into account.

Distance will be used as a tiebreaker for each over-subscription criterion.

Multiple births

• Key Stage 1

If only one place is available at the school and the next child who qualifies for a place is one of multiple birth siblings, only one child can be offered a place. This is because at Key Stage 1 it is against the law to admit more than 30 children into one class. In this instance the tiebreak will be random allocation by computerised system.

In this circumstance we will support the family and help them to look for an alternative school, if requested, where all children can attend together.

• Key Stage 2

If only one place is available at the school and the next child who qualifies for a place is one of multiple birth siblings we will ask community schools to go over their published admission number to support the family.

Islington Sixth Form Consortium Admissions Policy

All applicants must register their interest to attend the consortium in the Spring Term.

Students who apply before the published deadline will be contacted to attend a meeting at one of the Consortium schools to provide advice on options and entry requirements for particular courses. This information is also available from the Islington Consortium Prospectus.

In the event that there are more applications than places available, the following oversubscription criteria will apply:

1. Children Looked After
2. Students in Year 11 who attend one of the following three feeder schools (Highbury Fields School, Highbury Grove School and Central Foundation School) who meet the entry requirements for their chosen course.
3. External applicants who meet the entry requirements for their chosen course.

In the event of more applications than places available within any criterion, the tiebreaker will be distance.

Final offers of a place on a specific course for all students will be conditional on attendance at Enrolment Day in August, Induction in September 2010 (or prior notification of justifiable absence) and actual GCSE results.

The Consortium maintains the right to withdraw a publicised course if the number of students is insufficient.

The Consortium maintains the right to review and change the admissions policy.
