

## Consultation with disabled people

For all environmental services, consultation is key to the development of policies and delivery of services. Disabled and older people can be hard to reach through standard methods of consultation, but are disproportionately affected by any services which impact on the built environment. A first point of contact will often be with the many organisations of disabled people that exist in Islington.

**Disability Action in Islington** [www.daii.org](http://www.daii.org) is in touch with most of these, and it has also supported an Access Group for several years. A new DAI initiative, '**Making our Rights a Reality**', puts disabled people in the front-line in promoting accessibility, and will provide a focus for consultation.

The **Islington Disability Network** and the **Mobility Forum** have representation from a wide spectrum of disability interests, and are able to meet requests for consultation on a number of fronts.
