Who runs the toy libraries?

The Toy Libraries are a joint project run by Children's Centres and Islington Library and Cultural Services.

Who pays for the toy libraries?

Two of the toy libraries are funded by the local Children's Centre.

Our toys...

...are chosen by staff trained in working with young children. We look for toys that are fun, strong, educational and safe.

What have toys got to do with learning?

Toys are great fun and young people learn all sorts of skills through playing with toys - exploring how things work, improving concentration, discovering shapes, colours, size, developing language and dexterity skills, creating imaginative stories and forming social skills such as becoming independent, and sharing and learning from others.
