Summary

Islington is an exceptional area and this is demonstrated by the latest 'Key Statistics' from the 2001 Census. These consist of over 400 important measures agreed by central government on advice from the Office for National Statistics. Islington departs significantly from the national average in over three quarters of these measures and for just under one tenth of the cases it lies at the extremes.

The purpose of this document is to help those persons preparing a report or case based on the use of data from the 2001 Census. The information is presented in tables in such a way as to make it easy to identify which of the over 400 key measures are likely to be most appropriate for any particular purpose.

Key Statistics from the 2001 Census

Key Statistics

The 2001 Census took place on the 29th April 2001. The Office for National Statistics released over 400 key measures for each local authority in February 2003 together with similar statistics for England and Wales and the corresponding regions and counties.

These measures chosen by the Office of National Statistics in conjunction with central government provide an overall picture of each area appropriate for general use and for administrative tasks such as the calculation of support grants.

Each key measure stands on its own. Such measures include the number of people in a particular age range and the number of people in a given ethnic group. The key statistics do not cross-tabulate these measures. Information about the age structure of local residents belonging to a particular ethnic group, and thousands of other similar items, is available from the more detailed Standard Tables. This information is provided separately and will form the basis for subsequent documents in this series.

Numerical Count, Percentage Rate and Rank

Each key measure is available as a numerical count and as a percentage of an appropriate total. In addition sufficient information has been obtained from the Office for National Statistics to calculate the national rankings for each local authority.

Islington in the National Context

Even a brief examination of the key statistics for Islington indicates that the Borough is exceptional in respect of many of these standard key measures.

The aim of this document is to present all the key statistics for Islington in their national context. This has been done by looking at Islington's place in the national rankings for each of the 400 plus key statistics and seeing whether it fell within the top 20% or the top 10% and so on of local authorities. That is to say, whether the Borough is in the top quintile or the top (or for the sake of argument the bottom) decile respectively for that particular measure.

The tables presented here show clearly just how exceptional Islington is within the national context. Nearly three quarters of the key measures chosen by the Office for National Statistics with the approval of central government show the Borough to be in either the top or bottom fifth of English and Welsh local authorities. Approximately half the measures show Islington to be in the top

or bottom ranked ten percent while most significantly there are 34 measures for which Islington lies within the extremes at 1%.

Further details regarding each measure can be obtained from the appropriate table of key statistics. The number of the table is given in the left-hand column. The tables are contained in an associated document.

By presenting the key statistics in this way it should assist staff who wish to prepare a report for the Borough in respect of making a case or in making a point to central government and outside agencies. Users should therefore be aware that the presentation of the information in this document is free of any value judgements. For example it is not necessarily a good thing or a bad thing that a relatively low proportion of the population of Islington are over 60 years of age. It is up to the user of this information to present each key statistic in the appropriate context and to draw the relevant conclusions.

Calculation of Rankings

The rankings on which this information is based have been calculated by the Planning service of Environment and Conservation. Wherever possible the rankings have been checked against the small selection of rankings calculated by the Office for National Statistics and made publicly available. Care should be exercised in using this information as the rankings are mostly based on percentage rates for each key statistic which have been rounded. This is in addition to the fact that numbers on which they are based may also be adjusted to prevent the disclosure of information which might result in the identification of individuals. This caveat is important in Islington's case as many of its key statistical measures lie at the extremes where this sort of consideration becomes relevant.

Other Areas

Information for other areas such as other local authorities, Inner and Outer London, Greater London, counties and the regions as well as for England and Wales are contained within the tables of Key Statistics already released by the Office for National Statistics. Some of this information is contained within the separate document mentioned above and the rest can be supplied free of charge subject only to the copyright restrictions outlined below.

Information about wards and smaller areas within wards should become available sometime around July or August 2003.

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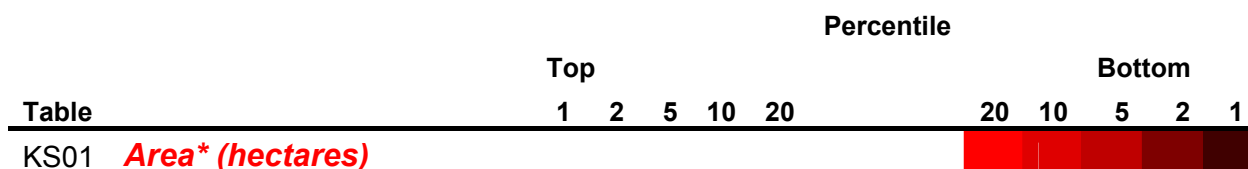
The Charts

The charts below list each Key Statistic against its table identifier and show by use of coloured banding just how exceptional Islington is in respect of certain particular measures.

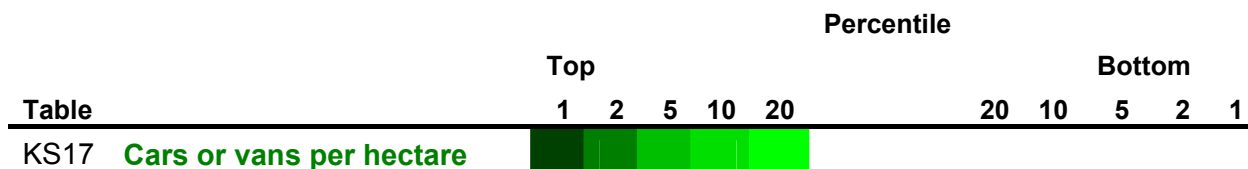
A **green** banding indicates that the Borough is ranked highly for that particular measure within the national context. The deeper the shading the higher the rank.

A **red** banding indicates that the Borough is ranked low for that particular measure within the national context. The deeper the shading the lower the rank.

For instance Islington is the third smallest local authority by area so the band for this measure is coloured dark red.



In contrast the vehicle density as measured by the number of cars and vans owned by residents is high so the band for this measure is dark green.



The ranking is not intended to constitute a value judgement and the colours have been chosen only to distinguish high and low ranking measures.
