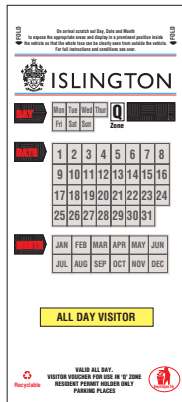
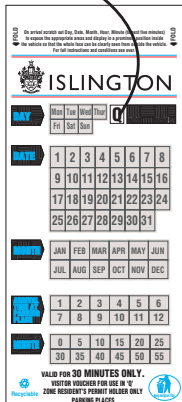
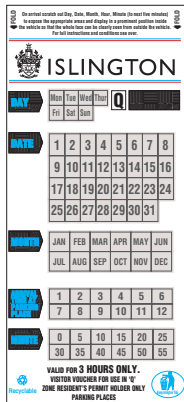


Parking permits and bays

There are many types of parking permits and parking bays. To avoid getting a parking ticket make sure that you park in the correct bay with your permit.

Visitor Voucher

Refers to relevant zone



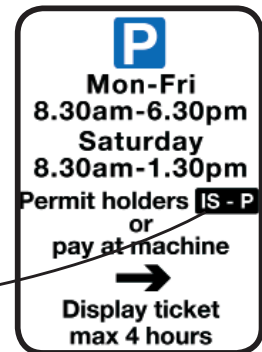
Resident Permit -

Parking permit signs

If you have any of the above permits and providing they are valid for the relevant zone, or you have a disabled badge or permission to park, you can park where you see these signs:

If you have a disabled badge holders can also park where you see this sign

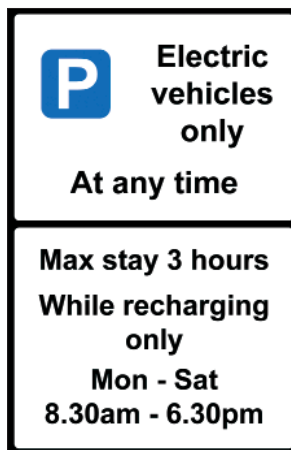
Do you have the correct permit?

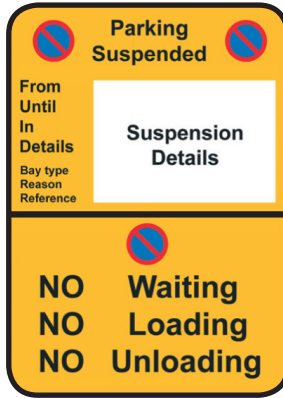

Parking suspensions

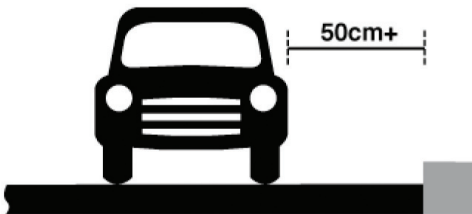
Sometimes bays are suspended. If you see this sign you may not be able to park even with your permit. You will need to read the sign for suspended parking dates.

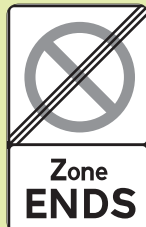
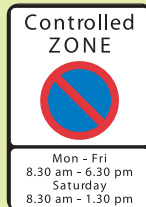
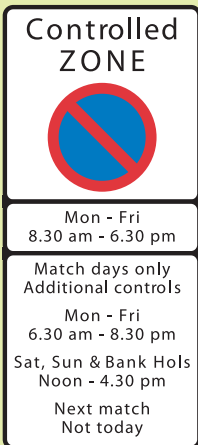
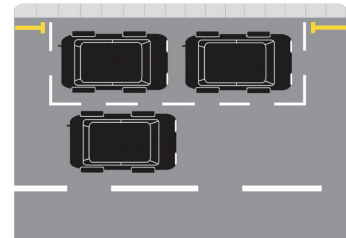
Don't park on the path

Footway parking is illegal. Only if there is an exemption sign may you park with your wheels on the pavement or verge within the area indicated.



Don't double park

Double parking and parking more than 50cm from the kerb is illegal and can be enforced at any time.



Controlled Parking Zones (CPZs)

Islington has a number of CPZs. The days and hours of control are shown on the Zone Entry Signs (like the ones shown here) and in individual parking bays in the controlled area. The hours vary from zone to zone. There are also signs to show where the zone ends. The restricted hours for single yellow lines that do not have a time plate will operate at the times indicated on the zone entry sign.

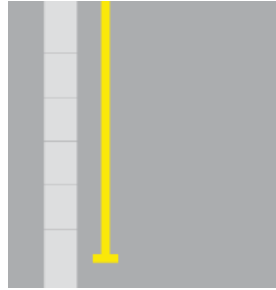


Waiting restrictions

Waiting restrictions are shown by yellow lines. The times appear on a nearby time plate if not within a Controlled Parking Zone. Single yellow lines apply for part of the day. Double yellow lines apply all of the time so will not have a nearby time plate.

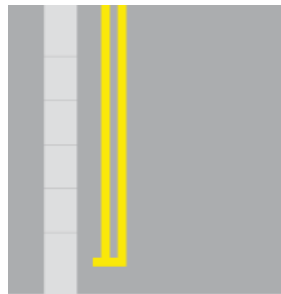
Where there are no loading restrictions you may park on yellow lines while loading heavy or bulky goods, but this is generally limited to 40 minutes and the activity must be continuous. This does not include activities such as buying a newspaper, using a cashpoint, or shopping. A Penalty Charge Notice (PCN) will be issued to those who leave their vehicle parked. Disabled badge holders may park for up to three hours if they display their badge and clock.

At any time. No sign required

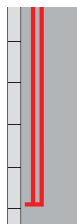


Loading restrictions

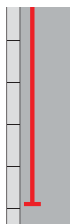
Loading restrictions prohibit parking even for loading. They are shown by yellow markings on the kerb. The restricted hours are shown by white plate signs. Disabled badge holders cannot park during restricted hours. One yellow kerb marking means no loading or unloading during the times shown. Two yellow kerb markings mean no loading or unloading at any time.



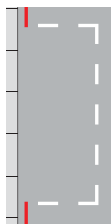
Loading restrictions



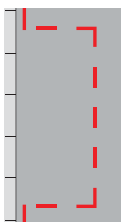
No stopping at any time

Only loading may take place at the times shown for up to a maximum duration of 20mins

When there are Arsenal matches or an event at the Emirates Stadium, the controlled parking zones (CPZs) near by have additional operating hours.

The extra operating hours are:

- from the end of the normal CPZ operating hours to 8.30pm
- Saturdays, Sundays and Bank Holidays - 12 noon to 4.30pm

Additional signs on the CPZ entry signs are put in place three days before a match / event and the bottom section of the signs will display the date of the match / event.
