RECYCLING

Use for **GLASS, PLASTIC, PAPER and CARD, CANS, FOIL, CARTONS and AEROSOLS.**

Empty and **rinse** all containers before putting them into the bin.

Remove film lids from plastic pots, tubs and trays and put them in the rubbish.

Do not use black sacks. However, you can keep your recycling in a plastic carrier bag and put the whole bag into the recycling bin.

FOOD RECYCLING

Use for **ALL FOOD WASTE** including **PEELINGS, EGG SHELLS, BONES** and **PLATE SCRAPINGS**

Islington Council recycles food waste to turn it into **electricity** or **compost**. We provide food waste containers and compostable liners for free.

Line your kitchen caddy with a compostable liner and put your food waste in it.

When you need to empty your caddy, **tie the top of the liner** and put it in the outside food bin.

GARDEN WASTE

Use for **ALL GARDEN WASTE** including **GRASS CLIPPINGS, GARDEN WEEDS, LEAVES, TWIGS, HEDGE TRIMMINGS**

Islington Council recycles garden waste to turn it into **compost**. We provide reusable garden waste bags for free.

To recycle your garden waste put it loose in your garden waste bag and place it out with the rest of your recycling on your collection day.

When you have more garden waste than can fit in your garden waste bags use any open sack or bag and place it along your council issued bags.

Re-use and recycling centre

If you want to get rid of small electrical items, bicycles or other things which could be re-used, you can visit the Re-use and Recycling Centre at 40 Hornsey Street, N7 8HU. Tel: **020 8884 5645**.

Opening times:

- Monday to Saturday
8am to 8pm
- Sundays (and Bank Holidays) 8.30am to 8pm
- Closed on Christmas Day and New Year's Day

Please note that if you're bringing a van you must give 24 hours notice.

There is a pedestrian drop off point at the security gate at the Hornsey Street entrance, available during opening hours only.

Recycling in houses

Islington provides recycling, food and garden waste containers so residents living in houses can recycle.

Please make sure you **put the right thing in the right bin**. Follow the instructions in this leaflet to see whether what you are throwing away can be recycled instead.



The benefits

Saving energy

Recycling helps to prevent climate change and environmental degradation, it saves energy and helps us transform existing items into something new.
