Islington Council are working in partnership with Islington Survivors' Network (ISN) to offer support to anyone who may have suffered sexual, physical, emotional abuse or neglect at an Islington children's home or foster care placement in the past. The council has commissioned a new service, dedicated to providing support to people affected in this way.

Support Available

Islington Council is extremely sorry for the council's past failure to protect vulnerable children. We know that those who were abused continue to suffer today. Islington Council is a different organisation today and safeguarding children from harm is our top priority.

Abuse suffered as a child can be very distressing for people to accept when they are adults and can affect people in different ways. Speaking out is often an important step towards rebuilding and recovery.

The services we provide aim to address and support individual social, mental, physical and emotional needs.

What happens when you contact us?

The service is confidential, safe and responsive. Anyone who contacts us will be listened to and dealt with sensitively. The service will:

- Offer support tailored to your individual requirements following an initial conversation to identify your personal needs.
- Provide assistance to access your files should you wish to see them.
- Deal with all matters confidentially.
- Assist you to access other support you may need such as psychological therapy services where appropriate.
