

## Admissions Policy

### **Our Vision**

At St Andrew's (Barnsbury) CE Primary School our vision is that all members are confident and persistent in the pursuit of high aspirations by using the talents that God has given us to achieve our goals.

We do this by having:

- a safe and happy Christian environment where everyone is respected and valued
- an inclusive broad, enjoyable and interesting curriculum
- high expectations of behaviour, self discipline and independence
- opportunities to pursue career and recreational interests
- high expectations to progress and excel
- opportunities to link with local and global communities.

St Andrew's is a Church of England Voluntary Aided Primary School. The ethos and practice of the school encompasses Christian values and our aim is to serve our local community.

We encourage prospective parents to come and view our school. Prospective parents are welcome to make an appointment to see the school at any time by calling the school office and further information about this and the application process is available in the London Borough of Islington Primary Schools Admission Brochure or online at [www.islington.gov.uk](http://www.islington.gov.uk).

As a one-form entry school we will admit thirty new entrants each year. All new children will be admitted to the Reception Class in September, after the child's 4th birthday – this is for a full-time place. The place may be deferred until later in the school year but not beyond the point at which a child reaches compulsory school age ( the term after the fifth birthday). But no later than the term after the child's fifth birthday, when s/he reaches compulsory school age. For children born between 1 April and 31 August, this is not beyond the beginning of the final term of the school year for which it was made. The school will hold any deferred place for the child. Where parents wish a child may attend part-time until they reach compulsory school age.

### **Admissions Criteria for St Andrew's School**

1.a) Looked after children: These are children in the care of the Local Authority. This includes children who were previously looked after but ceased to be so because they have become adopted or become subject to a child arrangements order or special guardianship order.

By a "looked-after child" we mean one in the care of a local authority or being provided with accommodation by a local authority in the exercise of its social services function. An adoption order is one made under the Adoption Act 1976 (Section 12) or the Adoption and Children Act 2002 (Section 46). A 'child arrangements order' is one settling the arrangements to be made as to the person with whom the child is to live (Children Act 1989, Section 8, as amended by the Children and Families Act 2014, Section 14). A 'special guardianship order' is one appointing one or more individuals to be a child's special guardian/s (Children Act 1989, Section 14A). Applications under this criterion should be

accompanied by evidence to show that the child is looked after or was previously looked after (e.g. a copy of the adoption, child arrangements or special guardianship order).”

1 b) Children with SEND with an Education, Health and Care (EHC) plan naming St. Andrew’s School will always be offered places.

2. Children who have brothers and/or sisters already attending the school at the time of admission: This refers to children who live at the same permanent address and have the same parents/guardians at the time the admission policy is implemented.

3.Children whose parents/guardians are practising Christians regularly worshipping at churches in the Barnsbury Team Ministry\* (which includes the following local churches – St Andrew’s Thornhill Square, All Saints Carnegie Street, Church on the Corner Barnsbury Road and the Paget Christian Centre Randall’s Road). Regular worship means attendance at a church service at least twice a month for a year. The clergy supplementary form completed by the vicar must be enclosed with the application.

4.Children whose parents live in the parish of the Barnsbury Team Ministry\* and are committed members of and regular worshippers in other Christian churches and Chapels: These must be members of Churches Together in Britain and Ireland and/or The Evangelical Alliance. Regular worship means attendance at a church service at least twice a month for a year. The clergy supplementary form must be completed by the Vicar or Minister of the church.

5.Children who live within the Parish of the Barnsbury Team Ministry\*: Places will be allocated on the basis of distance from home to school measured in a straight line determined by Islington Local Authority. Priority will be given to those who live nearest to the school.

6.All other applicants with priority being given to those who live nearest to the school: Distance from home to school is measured in a straight line determined by Islington Local Authority.

#### Tie Break

In the event that two children have the same distance from the school, then a decision will be made using random allocation.

#### Application Process

The Islington Primary Common Admission Form must be completed by Islington residents. Residents from other boroughs need to complete their home local authority admission forms. The clergy supplementary form (available from the school) must be completed if you wish church membership to be taken into account when your application is considered.

The responsibility for decisions on admission of individual children rests with the Governing Body. All applications will be considered equally against the criteria. Admission forms may be completed at any time up until the closing date. The final date for Islington residents to return their Primary Common Application Form to Islington Council School Admissions is in January each year. Please refer to your home local authority for exact closing dates. The St Andrew’s clergy supplementary form should also be completed and returned to the school by this date, if applicable.

All unsuccessful applicants for the Reception class who have not already been offered a place at a school which was a higher preference on their Primary Common Admission Form will automatically be placed on the waiting list for that year group. The waiting list will be held by the School until the October half term following the September in which children were admitted to the Reception class. The school will also keep a waiting list that will be regularly reviewed. Unsuccessful applicants also have the right to appeal, please contact Islington School Admissions for further advice.

The Governing Body reserves the right to withdraw the offer of a place if there is evidence that the application was fraudulent or deliberately misleading or where a parent has not responded to an offer by the specified date.

#### In year admissions

Applications for places in classes other than Reception are dealt with by the school. Applications for In- Year should be made at <https://www.islington.gov.uk/children-and-families/schools/apply-for-a-school-place>.

Please note that the clergy supplementary form must be completed if the applicant wishes church membership to be taken into account when the application is considered.

If a place is available in a particular class and there is no waiting list for that class, then the school will communicate the offer of a place directly to the family who has applied for it. If more applications are received than there are places available, then applications will be ranked in accordance with the Admissions Criteria set out in this policy. However, children who do not currently have a school place or the offer of a school place will be given the highest priority after looked after children.
