### **Background**

#### 1 2022-23 Estimated Falling Rolls Funding

- 1.1 Falling rolls funding forms a part of the Growth Funding element of the Schools Block. Each year, in an agreement with Schools Forum, an amount may be top-sliced from the DSG to support those schools who are experiencing short-term roll reductions and who have an Ofsted rating of good or better.
- 1.2 For 2021-22, following the annual autumn consultation with all schools, Schools Forum agreed to centrally retain £400k for a Falling Rolls budget. Furthermore, it was agreed falling rolls funding at a school level will be limited to a maximum of three consecutive years. This would allow the benefitting schools time and additional resources to plan their adjusted workforce requirements for future years whilst also providing some level of protection to retain staffing levels in the short term to meet the needs of the school.
- 1.3 For the purposes of this paper, it is assumed £400k will remain as a budget for 2022-23 and funding for schools with falling rolls will be made against this budget.
- 1.4 It should be noted that pupil numbers and funding allocations are estimated based on the latest data available; June confirmed acceptance numbers from Admissions.
- 1.5 The DfE are to announce 2022-23 notional funding allocations at LA and school level in the next 4-6 weeks but for the purposes of estimating falling rolls allocations the Base Rate has been inflated by an estimated 2.5%; this in recognition that 2022-23 will be the third and final year of the current Schools Block settlement agreement announced in September 2019.
- 1.6 An updated paper will be presented to Forum in November to include revised pupil numbers, following the autumn census, and known Base Rate factor values. Final DSG allocations will be announced in December and final budget recommendations will be presented at the January Forum.
- 1.7 The criteria and funding methodology used in Islington has been agreed as follows:
  - As per the DfE The school must have been judged good or outstanding at their last OFSTED inspection. DfE requirement
  - The total number of pupils on roll (NOR) has dropped by at least 5% between last October census and the previous year's October census. *Islington requirement*
  - Vacancy Capacity of school is a minimum of 15% of PAN (Published Admission Number). Islington requirement

- Local planning data shows the places will be required within the next 3-5 years.
- Funding will be capped to a maximum of three consecutive years
- Schools receiving growth funding are excluded.
- 1.8 At present, where a school meets all the above criteria, funding will be allocated using the following calculation:
  - the NOR as at last October census (2021) will be deducted from the NOR of the previous year October's census (2020). The result will be multiplied by the current Base Rate, appropriate to phase, pro rata April-August i.e. 5 months.
- 1.9 It should be noted that, should falling rolls funding be payable to academies, the local authority are required to allocate funding for the period from September until the following August.
- 1.10 Prior to capping arrangements, the table in Appendix A shows the estimated funding allocations for 2022-23 financial year. 7 primary schools would benefit from falling rolls funding but no secondary schools.
- 1.11 The table below shows a summary of the estimated funding to be allocated compared to current budget available.

1.12 Six schools whose current Ofsted status rates as Requires Improvement and exempt from the falling rolls funding allocation process. However, should their status change, four would become eligible for funding adding a further £471k to the existing estimated costs.
