Gay

Linus Baker leads a quiet life. At forty, he has a tiny house with a devious cat and his beloved records for company. And at the Department in Charge of Magical Youth, he's spent many dull years monitoring their orphanages.

Joss Lake <u>Future Feeling</u>

Trans

An embittered dog walker obsessed with a social media influencer inadvertently puts a curse on a young man - and must adventure into mysterious dimension in order to save him.

Malinda Lo <u>Last Night at the Telegraph Club</u>

Lesbian

A gripping story of love and duty set in San Francisco's Chinatown during the 1950s.

Set in an alternative Edwardian England, this is a comedy of manners, manor houses, and hedge mazes: including a magic-infused murder mystery and a delightful queer romance.

Sang Young Park Love in the Big City

Gay

Told in four parts, this is an energetic, joyful and moving novel that depicts both the glittering nighttime world of Seoul and the bleary-eyed morning-after.

Trans

Amy de-transitioned to become Ames, changed jobs and, thinking he was infertile, started an affair with his boss Katrina. Now Katrina's pregnant.

Brontez Purnell 100 Boyfriends

Gay

A filthy, unforgettable, and brutally profound ode to messy queer love.

Lesbian / Bisexual

Taylor Jenkins Reid The Seven Husbands of Evelyn Hugo

A legendary film actress reflects on her relentless rise to the top and the risks she took, the loves she lost, and the long-held secrets the public could never imagine.

Morgan Rogers Honey Girl

Grace is not the kind of person who goes to Vegas and gets drunkenly married to a woman whose name she doesn't know... until she does exactly that.

Tasha Suri The Jasmine Throne

Lesbian

One is a vengeful princess seeking to depose her brother from his throne. The other is a priestess searching for her family. Together, they will change the fate of an empire.

Colm Toibin The Magician

Gay
