


The masterplan principles and how Bingfield Park fits into the surrounding area


Proposed east-west walking and cycling routes


Proposed east-west walking and cycling routes

Below is a visual of Masterplan design option 2



This option has the under 7's play area to the north with a smaller informal sport court to the south of the 3G football pitch. The pitch is raised slightly to the same level as the paths and surrounding area. The 3 v 3 basketball court stands alone and is unfenced. The Crumbles Castle building is partially retained and developed into an area for skating, BMX and Climbing/Parkour. There is a new wildflower meadow, native hedge and new seating and trees in both design options.



Below is a visual of Masterplan design option 3



This option has the under 7's play area incorporated into the Crumbles Castle area retaining the tower and some of the walls of the castle. The 3 v 3 basketball court is to the north of the 3G football pitch. The 3G pitch and the outdoor gym and smaller informal sport court is at a lower level with seating along the length of the activity area. There is a new wildflower meadow, native hedge and new seating and trees in both design options.

Crumbles Castle playground, raising the level of the playground and retaining the tower and parts of the walls to create a new exciting playground. Play is centred around climbing using walls, nets and slides. The playground is entered via an accessible ramped footpath, and the elevated playground provides clear views across the park.

Crumbles Castle playground creating a sloping play space facing the park, retaining the tower and parts of the walls of the building, adding new play elements including swings, slides, climbing frames and a sand pit. The design includes a planted edge 'moat' and a bridge to enter the playground.
